These can damage the wound tissue and slow healing. Your provider may also ask you to irrigate, or wash out, your wound: Fill a syringe with salt water or soapy water, whichever your doctor recommends. Hold the syringe 1 to 6 inches (2.5 to 15 centimeters) away from the wound. Spray hard enough into the wound to wash away drainage and discharge.
